Minutes of Meeting, 1 March 2023

The meeting was held at the Forney Museum of Transportation, 4303 Brighton Blvd., Denver CO

The meeting was called to order at 7:31 pm MST, by President Dick Thompson. 29 member clubs were signed in.

Officers present were President Dick Thompson, 1st Vice President Tom Mansfield, 2nd Vice President Calvin

Craig, Treasurer Samantha Baker, and Secretary Richard Fritz.

Leo Boyle reported that no bills at the Colorado legislature appear to affect collector cars, either negatively or positively. Senate Bill 23-097 ("Motor Vehicle Theft and Unauthorized Use") deals with the increasing car theft in Colorado and approves increasing consequences for perpetrators, including making it a felony for any value of stolen vehicle. It is expected that there will be a bill dealing with catalytic converter theft but that has not happened yet.

Freedom to Drive (FTD): We have been advised that the FTD organization has ceased to exist due to lack of funding support from car dealers. FTD was to counter local regulations that limited use of private automobiles on public roads. The increased use of regulations rather than legislative laws in municipalities is becoming more common and these were coming from environmental groups.

Minutes: The minutes of the February CCCC meeting were approved as published.

27 member clubs have renewed for 2023, plus one Associate and one Individual.

2023 RMMA (Jeffco) Airport Show: Dick Thompson asked that clubs include the August 5th event in their club's calendar of events. If a club wants to be featured in the car show, contact Dick Thompson at 303-929-5533. We need to have more sponsors; Hagerty is no longer sponsoring events such as the Airport Show.

Concours d'Elegance: The June 4th Concours in Littleton will feature evolution of the automobile with decades of vehicles grouped together. CCCC is urged to promote the show but no one from CCCC has volunteered to coordinate our participation. Dick Thompson will advise the concours co-chairman Tom Scott that he cannot be

The Evolution of the Automobile

The theme for the 2023 Colorado Concours event will be "The Evolution of the Automobile" and the plan is to display a broad variety of automobiles beginning with an early Ford Model T, and other antiques of that period. There will be 8 to 10 cars of various makes and models for each decade, e.g., 1900-1919, 1920-1929, 1930-1939, etc. through 1999, with a total of 80 to 90 cars. The 'Evolution' cars will be in addition to the customary display of 350 sports cars.

We are soliciting and encouraging collector car clubs and individual owners to bring their cars for the special Evolution display.

A typical decade group could include:

1930-1939 2 General Motors, 2 Ford, 1 Packard, 1 Hudson, 1 Studebaker, 1 Duesenberg, 1 Other Classic.

The 2022 Colorado Concours event featured 350 entrants and raised over \$75,000 for the charity. There will be a \$50.00 entrant fee per car, which includes 2 entry passes and 1 event program guide. 
