The following are the minutes of the September 2023 Colorado Collector Car Council, from Notes taken by Calvin Craig, CCCC 2nd Vice President:

Notes on the CCCC meeting of September 7

Dick Thompson opened the meeting at 7:30 pm to a light attendance at Gateway Classic Cars. Eighteen member clubs and one individual member were in attendance. He started off with the benefits of selling a car via Gateway Classic Cars; ease of working with them, how the selling price is set, the positive aspect that the seller does not have to interact with potential buyers and the communication between Gateway and the seller.

Up next was Leo Boyle, our lobbyist. He gave an overview about the issue of the Denver metro area being out of compliance with EPA Air Standards for Ozone and how the state legislature is working on ideas for legislative action to bring the metro area into compliance. A working meeting of a group of legislators was held on August 28th. The meeting was primarily for education of what causes ozone, how it affects humans and the health issues. Leo stated that state Senator, Chris Hansen of Denver attended and made remarks about general information as to the causes of ozone and remedies for it. Also, state Senator Barbara Kirkmeyer of southern Weld County and far north Thornton, spoke in favor of preserving the oil and gas industry in Colorado and that in the process of attempting to reduce ozone, those industries should have protections. The legislature has in place a form of a Cash For Clunkers program to remove the 500 most polluting cars within the metro area. The "cash" most likely will be in the form of a voucher towards the purchase of an electric car. There have been 680 applications for this program. The money comes from a 27-cent tax on ALL home deliveries, be that Amazon, groceries, food from restaurants, any home delivery from a business.

Following Leo was Matthew Groves from the Colorado Automotive Dealers Association (CADA). Matthew spoke about how Colorado is working toward meeting 80% of California's goal for sales of electric cars by 2032. CA is wanting 100% sales of electric cars by 2035. Currently he states that the CO legislature has

no stomach for reaching 100% electric sales by 2035. The Feds in their attempt to help states achieve the CA goal (which 18 states have signed up with), manufactures will have to have 47% of their cars shipped to the states to be electric vehicles. His opinion is that to accomplish this the manufactures, for cars to those 18 states (includes CO), will ship few if any electrics to the western slope or eastern plains, thus unloading on the front range all of the required electric cars. Stellantis has already stated that they will quit shipping ALL internal combustion engines by 2032.

Neither Dick Fritz nor Samantha Baker were able to attend the meeting. A vote was held to accept both the minutes from the last meeting and the treasury report, which Dick gave a short overview of. Gross income from the Car Show at the Rocky Mountain airport was \$10,429.59. As some invoices are still outstanding, the net proceeds are not yet known, but Dick estimated a profit or around \$5,000.

Dick Thompson announced is stepping down from the role of running the car show for the CCCC. He asked for people to come forward to take over that duty for the CCCC. No one at the meeting spoke up except for Calvin who stated that he is still full time employed and could not take the time to run the car show, as it in-of-itself is nearly a full time job. Calvin also expressed that CCCC members need to step up and take this on and thanked Dick for his time and hard efforts in putting on the car show.

Calvin brought up an idea provided by a person that is a member of both the RPM Club and the Colorado Mopar club as an alternative way for the CCCC to raise money. His proposal is attached. Dick Thompson and a few others thought it may be a good idea, and something new.

Meeting was adjourned at 8:35 pm.

A Proposal for a Colorado Car Show Competition (CCSC)

As 2023 draws to a close Bandimere Speedway is wrapping up its final season, eliminating the yearly Club Clash competition. This competition provided several hundred racers with an opportunity to bring their vehicles to eight or ten events every summer. Until Bandimere reopens at a new location (if this indeed occurs) car enthusiasts find themselves looking for other car-related events.

To fill this need, we propose a statewide car show circuit throughout the summer, culminating in the crowning of a state-wide champion, complete with second and third place trophies.

Concept:

In 2024, CCCC will offer a Statewide car show competition spanning from April to October. Participants will attend specific car shows located across the state, accruing points at each event. At the end of the year, the CCCC will announce the winners in various categories, based on accrued points throughout the season. In addition to overall points winners, individual Car Clubs within the CCCC can use this points data to award winners within each club's membership.

Desired Outcomes:

- Provide regular car related events for automotive enthusiasts.
- Increase participation for CCCC club sponsored car shows.
- Appeal to car owners who do not currently participate in car club events.
- Encourage model or make specific owners to attend shows designed for all car enthusiasts.
- Encourage enthusiasts to attend shows outside their local neighborhood.
- Provide the CCCC with a project involving all member clubs who are working towards a common goal.

Schedule:

Ideally, the competition will use existing car shows. A May to October schedule allows for 20-26 shows throughout the season. Since the proposed competition accrues points over the season, participants who attend as many shows as possible will be in the best position to win the championship.

We should use as many CCCC related shows as possible, but established non-CCCC shows that are willing to support the competition may be approached to fill out the schedule.

To start the season, we will reach out to the members of each CCCC club and ask them to register for the season. Each registered member will receive a competition number to be used for scoring purposes. In addition, we can reach out to the general public during club events and encourage them to register as well. It's important to complete the registrations early in the competition, so competitors can accrue the maximum number of points.

If desired, the points system could allow competitors to choose some fraction of the point total for their final score (for example, choosing 16 shows out of a 20-show schedule). Because few people could make

every show in a season, this approach should see more car owners signing up for the competition, since it allows each competitor some time flexibility through the summer.

Scoring:

Scoring the competition can be very simple or extremely complex. Both approaches have pros and cons, but scoring should be designed with an eye towards promoting maximum participation through careful consideration of the vehicle categories, methods of points distribution, and how to factor in the awards packages for each participating car show. The following sections discuss some of the pros and cons of each concern.

Categories:

In general, categories can be make, model, or trim specific. To keep things simple, we suggest participants be grouped in the following six categories:

- GM
- Ford
- Chrysler
- Domestic Orphans
- European
- Asian

At the end of the year, the top two or three vehicles in each group will be awarded a class win.

Points:

Points are typically awarded by judges, fellow participants, or the general public. Each approach has limitations, but for our purposes we suggest a hybrid system as follows:

- 1) For every event, ask the general public (show attendees) to choose 5 cars they like the best.
- At ONE event for each Category (GM, Ford, etc) the club or clubs putting on the show will have a category specific "show within the show" and award bonus points to the home team.

For the category specific points competition, each club can use their preferred method to identify winners (judges, participant votes, general public votes), but cars in the statewide competition will receive these bonus points based on a predetermined scale.

By limiting these bonus points to one show per category per year, participants have one chance for bonus points each season. NOTE: The clubs involved in a given category could have two or more regional events, so long as each car only received bonus points in ONE regional competition.

Additional Issues:

This proposal is a rough outline designed to present the overall framework. All the ideas presented here are subject to review and modification. In addition, there are a number of issues that are not addressed, including the following:

- · How big an area should be included- Grand Junction? Durango? Julesberg? Craig?
- Will model or make specific car shows accept other cars participating in the statewide competition?
- Do existing car shows have room for addition cars?
- Is there enough support in the CCCC to accurately gather points from each competition?
- Does every registered vehicle receive points at a show, or limit points to a specific number (say ten cars)?
- The competition will have more GM cars than European models. Will this influence the scoring?
 Can weighting the points system balance out the categories?




