

LGCA Officers meeting

July 16th 2024

Kathy Hall, President called the meeting to order at the Clements Center at 10:00 am. Those present were President Kathy Hall, Vice President Sandy Seader, Secretary Jane Walker, Treasurer Ken Pfohl and Public Relations Officer Bob Burroughs. Also present was Guest Bill Hall.

Kathy Hall praised the hospitality of the Nebraska Corvette Club during LGCA's trip to Lincoln, NE. Dick and Vickie Stephenson, officers of the NE Corvette Club came to the hotel and escorted us to the museums. The Kuck Museum is a private collection of cars worth upwards of 50 million dollars. It was because of the connection between Tom Robben and Rollie Purifoy that we were able to visit this amazing collection. We also were escorted to the Museum of Speed. Bob Burroughs, Public Relations Officer had no club news to report. There was a brief discussion about Sandy Seader's experience with home care and dealing with Medicare. Because of Sam and Joe Parker's connection to Sterling the LGCA club members feel like we are treated special and always receive a warm welcome. There were 212 cars registered and LGCA had 15 cars in the show. Bill Hall and Phil Barnes' cars received awards and Doris Barnes won the "duck race." The club received \$100 for largest club in attendance but the club gave it back to the Sterling club. Booking rooms for the 2025 show will be available starting in January 2025.

There was no update about leaving August 25th to join the CA caravan for the Kentucky trip.

Bill Hall said Emich has agreed to a 50-50 drawing with the proceeds being given to the club's charity, Dave's Locker.

He said there are now around 55 cars registered for the Emich's Car Show 30 from our club. There will be 25 trophies - a first and second place trophy for regular cars and first place only for modified cars. If 4 items are changed a car is deemed modified. LGCA members will not be eligible for any awards.

Currently the club has lots of volunteers to work the event.

Regarding VOTR: it is getting more and more difficult to find donors, vendors and places to accommodate larger groups. In order to have one in 2025 a venue would need to be known by November 2024. In the past it has required around \$60,000 commitment from the club because of deposits required. A few small mountain towns like Buena Vista and Salida were suggested as possible destinations.
